Garth Silberstein is a third-year rabbinical student at Yeshivat Chovevei Torah, and the rabbinic intern at Congregation Kadimah-Toras Moshe in Boston, MA. An alum of the Pardes Institute for Jewish Studies, Garth has twice led Hazon's cross-USA bike ride from Seattle to Washington, DC, and recently founded Organic Yeshiva, an innovative program that combines traditional Jewish text study with hands-on experience working on an organic farm.
