

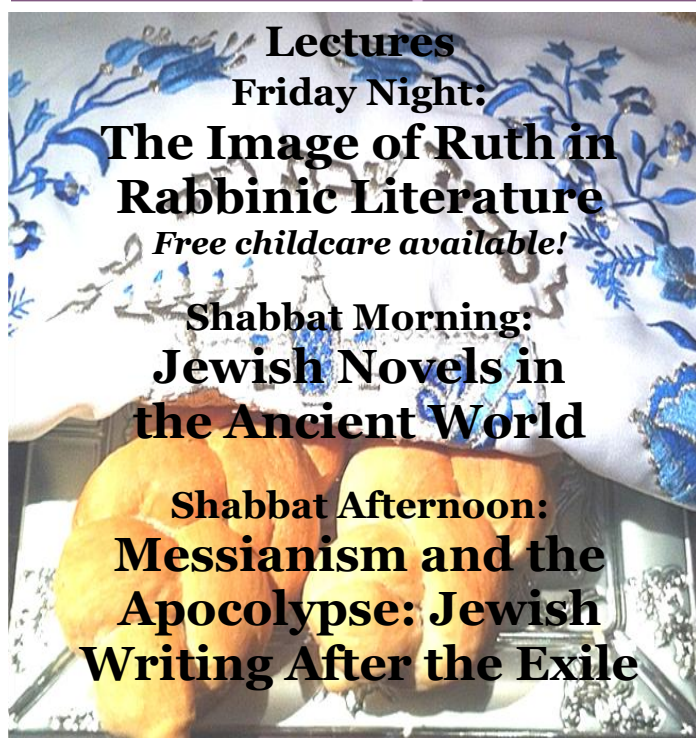

Dr. Malka Simkovich earned a doctorate in Second Temple Judaism from Brandeis University. She has an MA in Hebrew Bible from Harvard and a BA in Bible Studies and Music Theory from YU's Stern College. Her research focuses on universalist Jewish literature that was written in the late Second Temple period. Dr. Simkovich has published articles in the *Journal for the Study of Judaism* and *Harvard Theological Review*, and is also a regular contributor to TheTorah.com. She is currently the incoming Crown-Ryan Chair of Jewish Studies and Director of Catholic-Jewish Studies at Catholic Theological Union in Chicago. Dr. Simkovich published *The Making of Jewish Universalism: From Exile to Alexandria* (Rowman & Littlefield) last December and is completing a book on Second Temple Judaism to be published by the Jewish Publication Society in 2018.
